Train & Underground

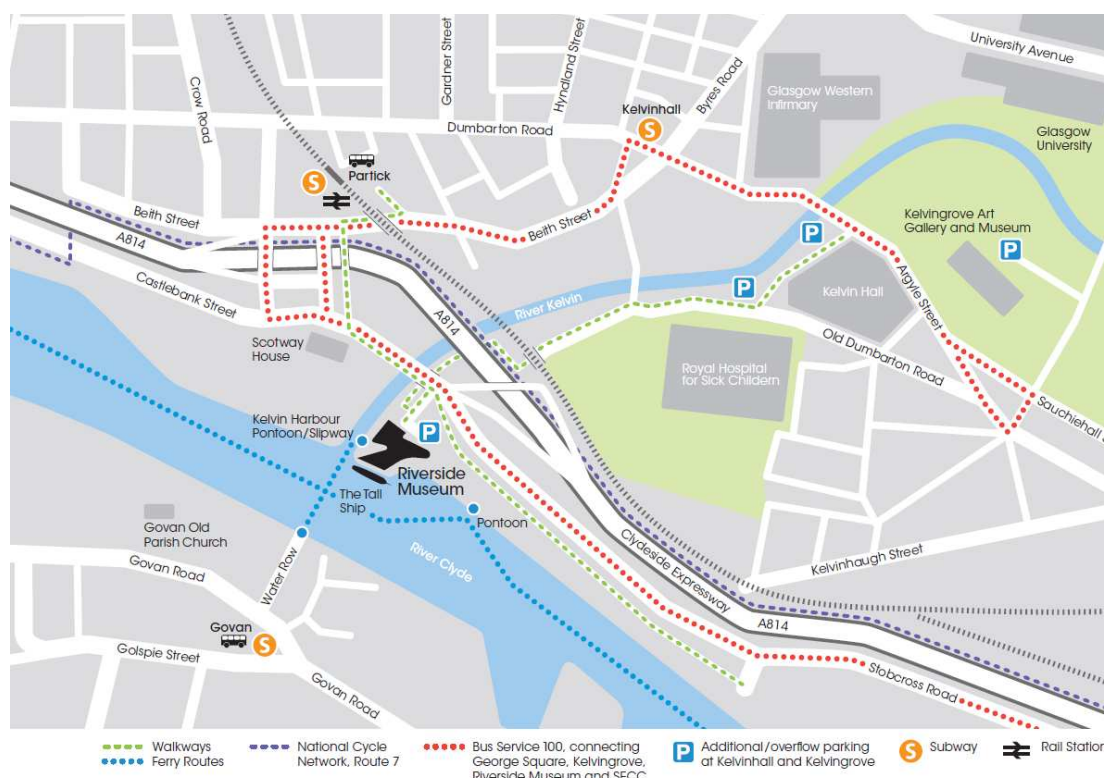
The nearest station for main-line and underground trains is Partick. It is then around a 10 minute walk to Riverside Museum.

Car

Riverside Museum is just off the Clydeside Expressway - M8, junction 19. There is a limited Pay & Display car park at the museum - £1 for 3 hours. Delegates should remember to feed the meter! The car park has 12 spaces reserved for blue badge holders and these spaces are free of charge with no time restrictions.
